

Volunteer Team



Our Team is very diverse, bringing together people of different ages, backgrounds, and cultures. We are an organisation which fully embraces Equality & Diversity, and we welcome everyone. We're currently working on-Site every Sunday morning, all year round. Although many of our weekly tasks centre around DIY, painting and gardening at present, we will soon require volunteers to man our Visitor Reception, opening in early spring.

So if you're interested in Volunteering, we'd love to hear from you and welcome you into our great team.

'Raise The Roof' Project

The North Wing roof of the Heritage Centre is deteriorating at a rapidly alarming rate, and is of very serious concern to us.

We were hoping it would remain intact until we were ready to commence the full restoration and renovation of the Wing; clearly, this will not be possible, as it now resembles a huge piece of Swiss Cheese. Most of the wooden purlins are



rotten, and the original 1940s concrete covered mesh roof sheets are disintegrating on a weekly basis. We need to act now, and replace the entire roof by this summer.

We are now focusing all our efforts this year, to raise £60,000 required for a new roof. It is



planned that the new roof will contain integrated photovoltaic cells, allowing us to generate solar power and create a self-sufficient 0% energy footprint, within the Site. Our Heritage Centre will use 100% renewable energy to, power, heat, and light the Centre.

Once the North Wing is water-tight, we can commence

its renovation; creating the largest single display area within the planned Heritage Centre. The North Wing consists of 8 bays, and each bay will cost approx £7,500 to replace.



Deblin Officer Cadet Visit

Polish Air Force Officer Cadets from Polish Air Force Academy Dęblin, traditionally attend the Annual Polish Air Force Commemoration weekend at RAF Northolt in September each year; and for the second year in succession, as part of our joint heritage and to increase their awareness of the RAF, they spent a few extra days in Lincolnshire visiting RAF Cranwell. As part of their visit to our county, we were again privileged to host them at RAF Ingham.



During their visit they were briefed, and shown a small display, depicting the history of RAF Ingham and the Polish Bomber Sqns. The visit also allowed the Cadets to experience where their fellow countrymen would have lived, worked and flown from, some 75+ years previously. The Cadets were deeply moved by their visit; and we look forward to welcoming the next intake of Officer Cadets, next year.





Hatfield Memorial



We were invited to attend the unveiling of a new Memorial Board on Hatfield Moor, to the crew of PAF Wellington of 305 Sqn, that crashed on the Moor on 27 Sep 1941. We gathered with a group of local Polish families, as the Memorial Board was unveiled by



Monika from the Polish Consulate, Manchester, and some of the Polish children. We then proceeded onto the Moor, to the Crash Site itself, where prayers and dedication were said.

Now that the Volunteers Workshop structure is complete, we're hoping to be installing an electrical supply and the internal workbenches and equipment, by early in the Spring. Our thoughts will then turn to our restoration projects themselves. We have two distinct projects: the AEC Matador 6x6 0854 Airfield Refueler, and the Brockhurst Bowser Trailer. We're fortunate that several of our new volunteers have specific mechanical, electricial, and carpentry skills, and are extremly keen to get involved. We have copies

of technical drawings of the vehicles, along with a great pool of knowledge from people, who've either worked on AECs, or undertaken their own restoration projects on similar vehicles.

Roland Chorazy Visit

In July, we welcomed Roland Chorazy, who had travelled from NSW, Austrailia, on a voyage of discovery, to visit the airfields his Father, Edward Chorazy had flown, as a Pilot with 300 Sqn, including RAF Ingham. We were able to show Roland copies of the original Operational records, detailing his Father's missions from RAF Ingham.





Polish Scout Camp - Fenton

We renewed our connection and friendships with Polish Scouting, when we were invited to attend their end of season event at Fenton Polish Scout Camp, Fenton, (just outside Lincoln, in September. Despite the regular showers of rain, the scouts had a great day, and they and their leaders/parents were fascinated to learn about PAF heritage, and about what we're aiming to achieve at RAF Ingham.







New Visitor Reception

If you've visited the Site over the last few years you'll have been greeted by a ramshackle collection of blue portacabins and shipping containers. Not anymore! As part of our evolution, it was decided to re-roll the existing Exhibition Cabin, bring together the remaining other units, and create a new Visitors Reception and Shop.

The project involved copious amounts of green paint, a fair amount of groundwork's, and lot of hard work and elbow grease! And all through the wettest Autumn in memory.

With a new coat of paint, and some fantastic help from **Lindum Group Ltd**, who provided the Hiab lift capability, we were able to re-position the cabins into their new configuration.

We're planning to open the newly refurbished Visitor's Reception in early Spring.







Pirate Gold

In May, we were contacted by BBC Radio Lincolnshire, and asked to be one of the locations for their Sunday morning programme 'Pirate Gold'. This is very similar to the TV programme of the 80s *Treasure Hunt*, starring Aneka Rice. We were delighted to accept, and on Sun 9 June, we were chosen as the 3rd location for that mornings broadcast. Great secrecy had to be maintained, with volunteers only being informed on the Sunday itself. We hid our 'Clue' on the Airmen silhouettes.

Going Commercial

As part of our drive to create a self-funding Heritage Centre, we have created a commercial side to our operations. As a Registered Charity, we cannot trade commercially, so we are in the process of launching 'Ingham Aviation Trading Ltd'. The company will manage the Visitor Reception Shop, the on-line shop, and in the future, our Cafe and Heritage Centre Reception. The company will be run by volunteers, with all profits coming back to the Heritage Centre, via the Charity.

Since creating our Memorials and Memorial Gardens in 2016, we've spoken to many of the families and descendants of the men and women who served with the Polish Air Force Bomber Squadrons, and those who served at RAF Ingham (Cammeringham).

Originally, the intention was for the building to become the volunteers workshop; however, with the arrival of the New Workshop, this building is being re-rolled, as future Exhibition Room.
